

Management of Domestic Incidents February 28, 2003

Policy

To prevent, prepare for, respond to, and recover from terrorist attacks, major disasters, and other emergencies, the United States Government shall establish a single, comprehensive approach to domestic incident management

HSPD-5 Homeland Security Presidential Directive - 5

Crisis management and consequence management will be treated as a single, integrated function, rather than separate


The Secretary shall develop and implement a National Response Plan that shall integrate Federal Government domestic prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery plans into one <u>all-hazards plan</u>





ICS Incident Command System



General Staff

AC Area Command

Structure that manages multiple incidents that are each being handled by a separate command organization

- Only activated if necessary
- Depends on the complexity of the incident and span-of-control considerations



ICP Incident Command Post

- Location of Incident General and Command staff
- Located near incident site
- All incident decision-making











EOC Emergency Operations Center

- Coordinates information and resources to support incident command
- Located off-site
- Core functions include:

Coordination
Communications
Resource allocation and tracking
Information collection, analysis, and dissemination





JIC Joint Information Center

- Established to coordinate the release of information and other public affairs functions
- Serves to coordinate timely release of incident-related information to the public and the media
- Provides victim and family information





JOC Joint Operation Center

- Mostly Department of Defense term
- Joint force commander's headquarters for planning, monitoring, and guiding the execution of the commander's decisions





JOC Joint Operation Center

- Mostly Department of Defense term
- Joint force commander's headquarters for planning, monitoring, and guiding the execution of the commander's decisions.





PL-100-707 Stafford Act

- Mechanism by which the Federal Government provides support to State, tribal, and local governments
- Creates the system by which a Presidential Disaster Declaration of an emergency triggers financial and physical assistance through FEMA

EMAC Emergency Management Assistance Compact

- When additional resources are required
- Interstate mutual aid and assistance agreement
- Provides form / structure to interstate mutual aid process





HVA Hazard Vulnerability Assessment

- Identification of hazards that are most likely to have an impact on a facility and the surrounding community
- Four categories:

Probability

Response

Human Impact

Property Impact on a facility.

Categories based on a point system (0 to 3)

ESAR-VHP

Emergency System for Advanced Registration of Volunteer Health Professionals

- Administered by DHHS
- Registers health volunteers
- Applies emergency credentialing
- Verifies identity, credentials, and qualifications of volunteers

ASPR

Assistant Secretary for Preparedness & Response

- Formerly the Office of Public Health Emergency Preparedness (OPHEP)
- Secretary's principal advisory staff on matters related to bioterrorism and other public health emergencies
- Coordinates activities between HHS and other Federal departments for emergency preparedness

SNSStrategic National Stockpile

- National repository of pharmaceuticals and medical materials delivered to a site to support local resources
- Contains antibiotics, antidotes, other pharmaceuticals, and medical / surgical supplies
